by questioning it. Today we also question everyone and everything! But the content of this short book is also very relevant to our current modern and postmodern ways of thinking. Through Malachi, the Lord seeks to correct wrong thoughts and attitudes. He addresses 6 important life issues. The Israelites then and we today are encouraged to: 1. See Gods hand in our life and be thankful [1:2-3]; 2. Respect God's authority over us (as Father, Lord, great King) [1:6-14]; 3. Be faithful in our relationships, especially with our marriage partner [2:10-16]; 4. Accept God's standards on morality [2:17]; 6. Live as administrators and not as owners of the blessings God gives [3:7-10]; and 6. Serve the Lord wholeheartedly - serving God is worthwhile! [3:13-18]. It is amazing how the way of thinking of the culture we live in unconsciously affects our values and priorities. Some 500 years after Malachi, Paul had a similar concern for the Christians who lived at the centre of the Roman Empire. He wrote, "Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is, his good, pleasing and perfect will" (Rom. 12:2). We also need regular calls to wake-up!
